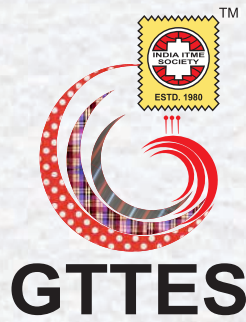

A New Catalyst for Textile Engineering Industry

Global Textile Technology & Engineering Show-2015 by India ITME Society created a landmark event for Textile & Textile Engineering Industry in India & overseas. The event which focused on Post spinning Sectors attracted exhibitors from 12 Countries & visitors from 32 Countries with visitor flow continuing late into evening on 3rd day even after closing time of the exhibition.

India International Textile Machinery Exhibition Society was established 35 years ago, in 1980 with the objective of bringing modern technology to India and thus be a catalyst to growth of Textile Engineering Industry. Having successfully accomplished the task, a new challenge was taken up by the industry body this year to access new markets, to widen network, to explore new opportunities for Textile &, Engineering Industry.

With Asia now becoming centre of Textile market and huge potential possible in India, there was a need and place for an event like GTTES. As such, India ITME Society launched this new business event as an effort to create an concentrated access to new and developing markets in Asia and Africa. India International Textile Machinery exhibitions Society popularly known as India ITME Society launched first edition GTTES to meet the need of the industry especially in the post spinning sectors and also to give a focused attention to small medium buyers from regional markets. This event gave a clear platform to Weaving, Processing, Garmenting, Knitting etc.

On 7th April 2014, first edition GTTES was announced and the booking was thrown open online. The event concluded successfully with 285 Exhibitors from 12 countries and 29000 Visitor footfall spanning 32 countries. For India ITME Society it was a historic moment to launch a second International Exhibition and surging forward in its purpose of creating opportunities, pushing industry growth and ensuring continued momentum for Textile Engineering Industry.

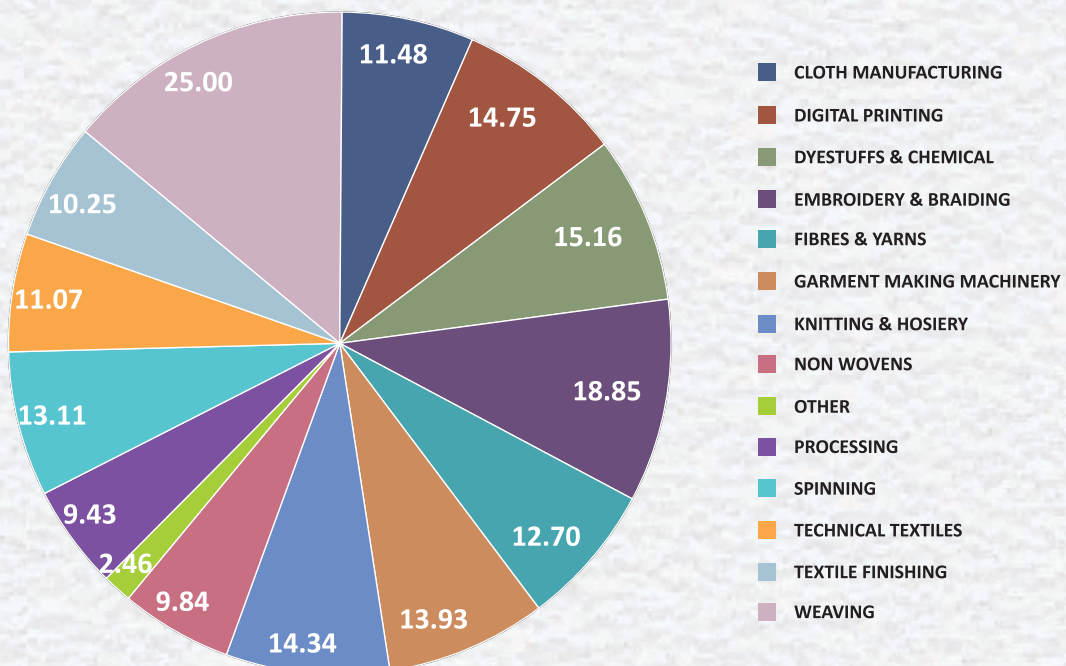

Primary Business - Visitor

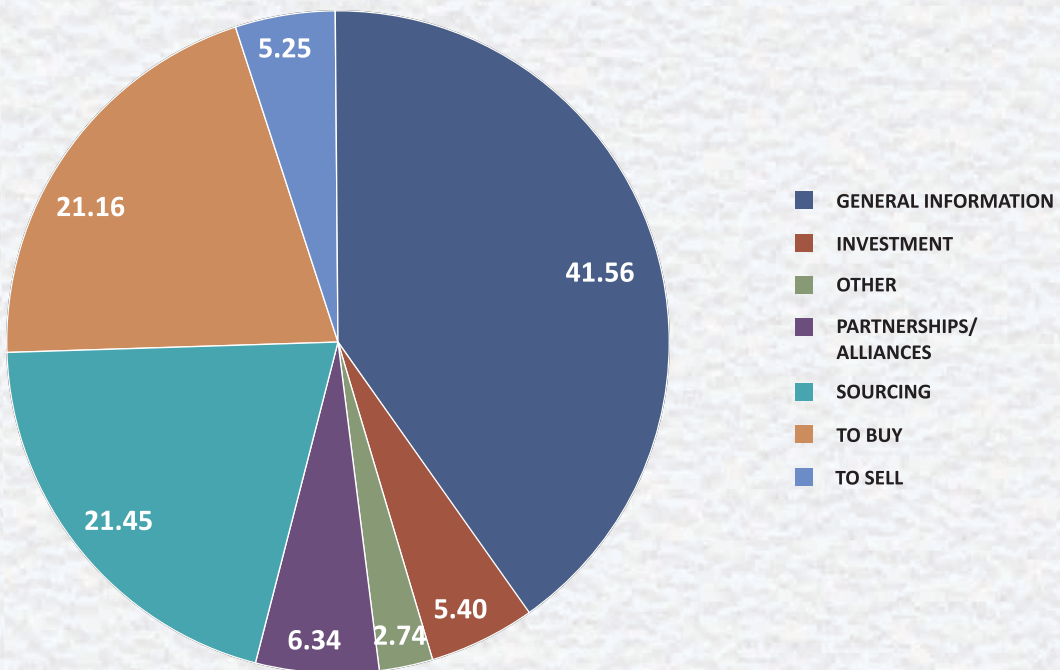


Primary Business - INTL Visitor

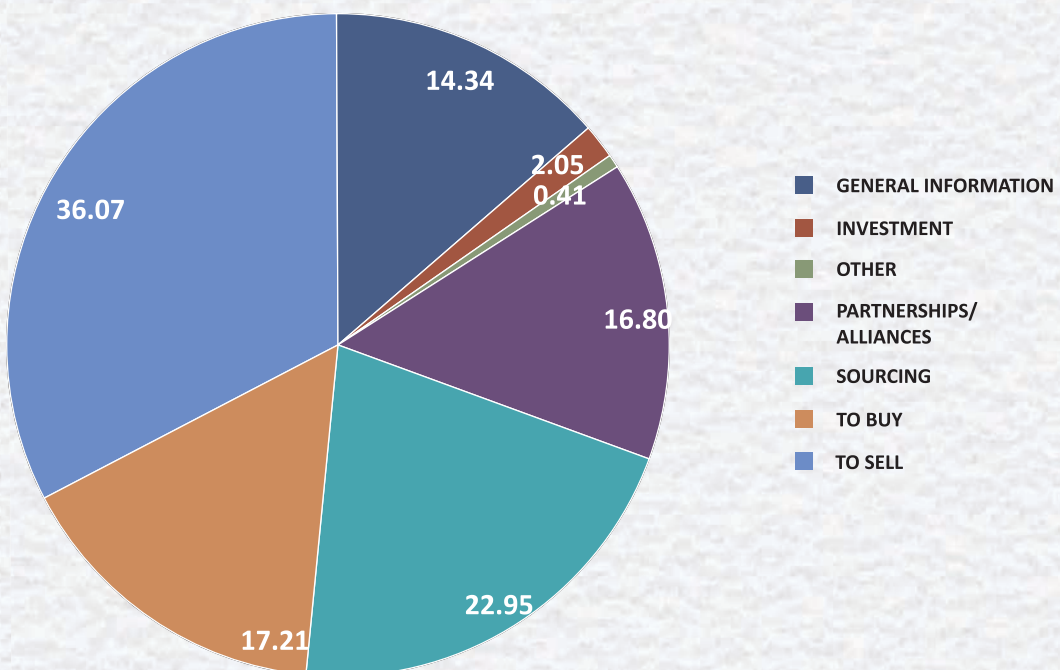




Purpose of Visit - Visitor

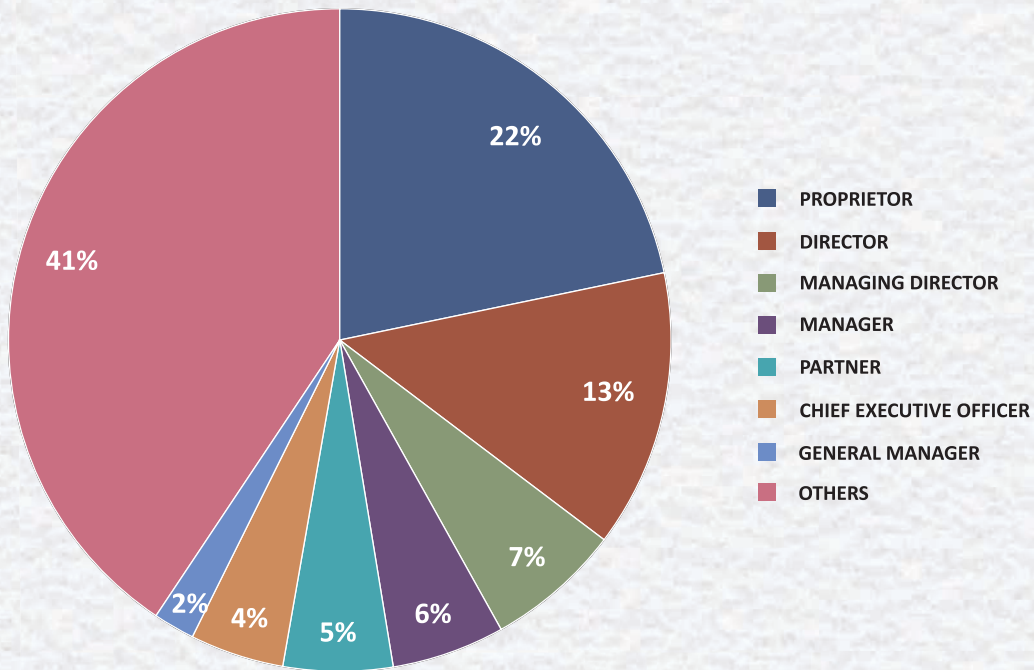

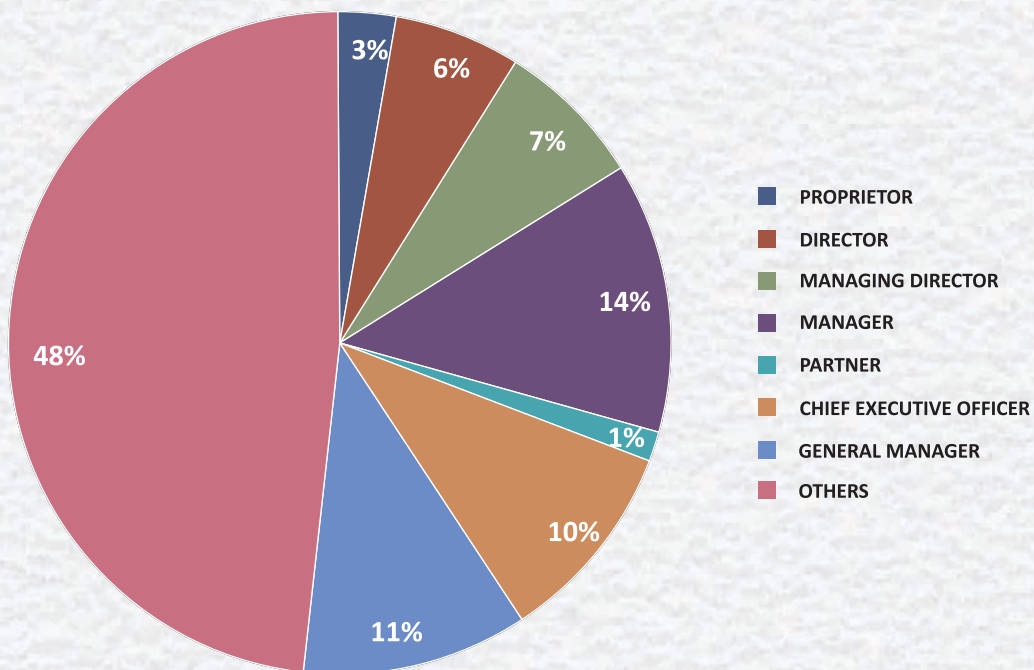

Maiden GTTES makes indelible impression

GTTES 2015, organised by the India-ITME Society at the Bombay Exhibition Centre for three days starting January 20, 2015, set a new trend in exhibition by focusing on the Asian market, with about 250 exhibitors touting their wares.
